- To apply call (877) 644- 6562 or go to www.unemployment.ohio.gov to file online
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP): Those who did not already receive the maximum monthly allotment for their household size from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (**SNAP**) in March will be issued an additional payment beginning this week.
- All SNAP-eligible households will also soon be able to pick up a pre-packaged box of food at their local food bank. Ohio obtained federal approval to waive the administrative verification normally required at food banks to streamline the process and limit person-to-person contact.

- Emergency Service for Rental Assistance available through Community Service Block Grant (CSBG)
 - To help low to moderate income families' prevent eviction and to help maintain normal day to day functioning.
- Priority is given to customers/households that request M.E.O.A.G. Inc. Financial/Self Sufficiency guidance and complete the appropriate paperwork.
- The Eviction Assistance program can assist with up to \$1,500.00. This program is only available as CSBG grant funds are available.

Muskingum County Community Action (continued)

Eligibility Requirements:

- Muskingum County Resident
- At or below 125% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines as established by HHS
- Provide Income Verification for everyone in the household (based on either 90 days or 12 months' income verification)
- Provide valid ID (individual applying)
- Provide social security cards (or crib card if social security card not available) for everyone living in the home
- Assistance limited to one time per household within a 12-month period
- Provide eviction notice
- Provide lease agreement
- Must cooperate with M.E.O.A.G. Inc. in leveraging other funding and programs when applicable.
- *Special circumstances may warrant additional assistance to be provided. These special circumstances will be on a case by case basis only for customers/households participating in the Financial/Self Sufficiency guidance offered by M.E.O.A.G. Inc.*
- During the COVID-19 concern, intake will be taken care of primarily by phone at **740-454-1310**, with arrangements made for necessary documents to be received.
- Winter Crisis program has been extended through 5/1/2020
- HEAP program has been extended through 6/1/2020
